The Solemnity of the Assumption  
Of the Blessed Virgin Mary  
Wednesday, August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2018

Pope Benedict XVI wrote that “precisely because Mary is with God and in God, she is very close to each one of us. While she lived on this earth she could only be close to a few people. Being in God, who is actually ‘within’ all of us, Mary shares in this closeness of God.” Our Lady “knows our hearts, can hear our prayers, can help us with her motherly kindness. She always listens to us and, being Mother of the Son, participates in the power of the Son and in his goodness. We can always entrust the whole of our lives to this Mother.” The Blessed Mother’s birth into heaven generates in us “an ever new capacity to await God’s future” (Saint John Paul II). “Mary lifted herself up to such lofty heights of heaven that the Word reached down from the highest pinnacle of heaven and took her in” (A. Autpert). (Magnificat)

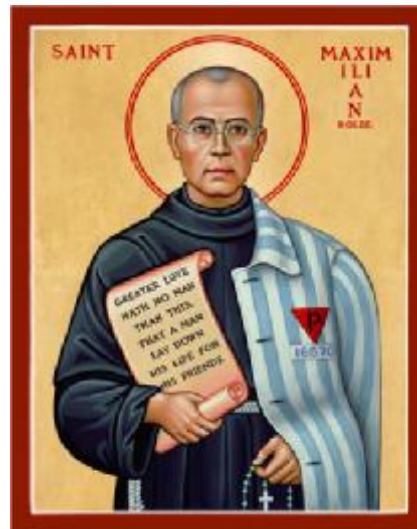

**St. Maximilian Kolbe**

Maximilian Kolbe was born in Russian Poland to a young laborer and his wife in 1894. At the age of ten, Mary appeared to him and offered him two crowns: red, for martyrdom, or white, for purity. He chose both. As a young Franciscan friar, his passion for Mary, his “Mamusia,” was expressed in the

Knights Immaculata, the movement of Marian consecration he zealously spread through a print apostolate. In February 1941, he was arrested by the Gestapo and eventually sent to Auschwitz. There he offered to take the place of a fellow prisoner sentenced to the starvation bunker. He died as a “martyr of charity” on August 14, 1941. (*Magnificat*)
