**Saint Anselm**  
(1033-1109)

Anselm took a detour on his way to greatness. As a boy in Italy, he thought of becoming a priest. His father, however, introduced him to court life. The lifestyle, with few responsibilities and many pleasures, made Anselm forget about his vocation. Then after his mother's death,

Anselm became interested in Lanfranc, a popular spiritual leader of monasticism in Normandy, France. Lanfranc's monastery was said to be the best school, and when Anselm entered it to be a monk, he made friends with Lanfranc. Three years later Anselm became prior and began to publish his writings on God.

In the monastery Anselm was known for his virtue and his teaching. The monks praised his way of dealing with people. He was unanimously elected abbot in 1070, when Lanfranc was made archbishop of Canterbury in England. William the Conqueror had gained control of England in 1066 and was reorganizing the government and the Church under Norman lords. When Lanfranc died in 1089, the English clergy wanted Anselm as archbishop; however, Rufus, William's son, would not approve. For four years there was no archbishop of Canterbury.

Then suddenly Rufus became mortally ill. In fear of hell, Rufus appointed Anselm archbishop of Canterbury. Knowing he would come into conflict with Rufus, Anselm at first refused the appointment. The pope, however ordered him to accept.

Rufus recovered and fell into his former sins, taking Church lands and attempting to appoint bishops. Anselm told the bishops that their obedience demanded they be loyal to the pope and ignore the king's interference in Church matters. Frightened by the conflict between the archbishop and the king, bishops and priests abandoned Anselm. The king then exiled him. In exile Anselm wrote papers in defense of the faith and took part in the Council of Bari, where he spoke eloquently on the Holy Spirit.

After Rufus was killed in a hunting accident, Anselm returned to England. Henry I, brother of Rufus, was now the king and continued to rule as his predecessor had. Henry also wanted to appoint bishops, and Anselm refused to accept his appointment from the king. Again Anselm was exiled to Rome. Pope Paschal worked out a compromise between the king and the bishop. He ruled that only the Church could invest a bishop with the ring and the crozier, but the king would have some power in the selection of bishops.

Until his death Anselm remained in England, defending the faith. His holiness, patience, and love of the Church were so well respected that Canterbury came to be recognized as the most important church in England. In 1720 Anselm was given the titles Doctor of the Church and Father of Scholasticism because he analyzed and taught the truths of the faith by the aid of reason. The Church encourages the faithful to live as Anselm did – loyal to God in every situation.

**Did you know?** Anselm had great compassion for the sufferings of Christ on the cross. The Cistercians promoted this spirituality, and it was through them that we have the crucifix – the representation of Christ dying on the cross. Before this time Christ had been represented as crucified but glorified.
